There can be no greater gift than to share the life and time with a man of God. Joel Jackson, Or. was the epitome of what a Christian should be. Joel was a man who was always giving, helping, sharing and mentoring to all he came into contact with.

Joel was born May 31, 1950 in Memphis, Tennessee to the late John Jackson II and Hattie Joe Jackson. He accepted the Lord as his personal Savior at an early age and became a member of the Mt. Gilliam Missionary Baptist Church and later joined Westhaven Baptist Church where he served as a Sunday School Superintendant.

Joel was a proud 1968 graduate of Melrose High School and a member of the last "12 Year Society" of the school. He received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Memphis and began working in management for J.C. Penney's and Service Merchandise. He was also employed by Continental-Express Jets Airlines. Joel became Co-owner and principal broker for YuJack Realty where he received the real estate designation of GRI, later a broker for AAA Realty, and then a broker with Simpson Harris Realty and remained a member in good standing with the National Association of Real Estate Brokers. Always believing in entrepreneurship, Joel created Melrose Place and purchased the ideal location, right across the street from Melrose Stadium, and became known throughout Orange Mound as the "T Shirt Man."

Joel truly loved Orange Mound and Melrose High School and would offer his assistance throughout the Orange Mound Community. He was a dedicated member of the Orange Mound Parade Committee and worked tirelessly to ensure the parades such as the Annual Salute to the Southern Heritage Classic commenced each year and used Melrose Place as a watering station for the parade participants. His charitable giving expanded to other organizations, such as Orange Mound Community Center, Senior Citizen Services, and G.W. Carver High School. Joel donated goods or services to Carver's girls' softball team, basketball team, faculty and to the George Washington Carver National Alumni Association. As a result of his support, he was inducted into the Carver Hall of Fame.

Joel and his brothers would often sit on the porch of Melrose Place discussing the happenings in the "Mound" and what need to be done to improve. Others would drive by and stop to join in or just blow their horn and wave. Melrose Place became a hub or meeting place for many and Joel never turned anyone away joining the talk.

Joel departed this life Wednesday, April 29, 2015 at Baptist Hospital East. He was preceded in death by his brothers, Jimmy Lee Jackson, John Jackson III, and Jerome Jackson. Joel's memory will be cherished by his wife of 39 years, Algenner Jackson, his daughter, Tamisha Morris, his son, Joel Jackson, Jr. (Sharlotte), his brothers, Joseph Jackson, Jarvis Jackson (Candice), Jonenson Jackson (Cynthia), and James Jackson, his sisters, Jeraldine Jackson and Jacqueline Holland, five grandchildren, Maya, Daizha, Juwan, Alana, and Kelsey, one aunt Charliss Anderson (Clinton), two uncles, Arbis Warford (Mary Elizabeth), Thomas Warford (Beverly), long time friend, Gregory Davis, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and a host of other relatives and friends.


